At Chellaston Junior School...

We like you to :-

- Work and play in a sensible way.
- Try your best all of the time.
- Look after yourself and your belongings.
- Take care of things that belong to other people.
- Be polite.
- Be kind to other people.

We will give you:-

- A water bottle .
- Exercise books, a pencil and ruler.
- A reading book and reading record.
- A home/school diary.
- A list of spellings to learn. You will have a test at the end of each week.
- Regular activities to practise at home. Ask someone at home to help you with these.

If you are good, do your best and work hard you may be given:-

- Team points
- Stickers
- Certificates
- A Privilege Card
- You may be chosen as your class's 'Pupil of the Week'

- Your name may be put in the Good Book and read out in Friday afternoon's assembly
- Your work may be put on the wall. It may be shown to the rest of the school in our special assembly.
- If you line up sensibly and quietly at the end of break times you will help your class to collect green and gold stars. At the end of each half term the class in each year group with the highest star total is allowed to have a non-uniform day.

We would like you to bring:-

- A small school bag (we do not have room for big ones) to carry your things to school in.
- A pencil case with a spare pencil, a pencil sharpener, a set of colouring pencils and a glue stick.
- A drawstring bag to keep your PE/Games kit in **with your name clearly written on it**. This should be left in school during the week.
- A set of felt tip pens would also be useful.

Please remember to put your name on all of your things.

You should not bring to school:-

- Jewellery other than watches (small, stud-type earrings may be worn but must be removed or taped for PE and games)
- Toys
- Mobile phones
- Any sweets or food except for fruit (dried or fresh) or raw vegetables (eg diced carrots)
- Any money, unless you have been asked to.

The School Day:-

The school gates are opened at 8.45am each day and we do not expect you to arrive before then unless you are attending an 'early morning' club.

School starts at 8.55am—if you are late for any reason, your parent will need to accompany you to the School Office and sign the 'Late Book'.

There is a short break in the morning. School finishes at 3.35pm.
