### Y6 Residential – Culmington Manor, Shropshire and Activity Days - June 2019

The total cost of for all activities, accommodation and travel will be £255 per child, £155 for children who are eligible for Pupil Premium funding. **Please note that a £50 deposit is needed by 19 October to secure your child's place on the Y6 residential trip.** Bookings are now open on ParentPay.

Y6 pupils also have the opportunity to participate in three Activity Days on the same dates, leaving from school each

morning and returning in the evening. The activities are likely to include a theme park, climbing and canoeing and possibly a trip to the seaside. The total cost for these activity days, including travel, is likely to be in the region of £75 and more details will be available later in the year.
