
Y3 Visit to Creswell Crags

A reminder on Sun safety advice



As we are now approaching summer, we wanted to remind you of a few things to ensure that your child is safe at school:

Water bottles: It is essential that children bring in a water bottle filled with chilled, fresh water at the start of the day – this can be topped up at school as necessary. Water bottles are on sale at the school office.

Sun hat: Please ensure you send your child to school with an appropriate sun hat (named), ideally to remain at school at all times during the months May through to the end of September. This is necessary to ensure that your child has access to the appropriate items that will help protect them from over exposure to UV during outdoor activities and break times - the majority of which are taken at the hottest times of the day, when UV penetration is at its strongest. Sun hats should be either legionnaire or broad brimmed, bucket style hats that shade the face, neck and ears. Sun hats should be worn for all outdoor activities during the summer term. Hats must be removed before entering the school building.

Sun screen: Parents are encouraged to ensure that all children have applied a high factor sun screen each day. This should be the single application type so that it does not require re-application during the school day.

Sun glasses: UVA/UVB sunglasses are permitted for those children who need them. They must not be mirror / reflective glass type. Parents who let children wear them do so at their own risk. Sunglasses must be removed before entering the school building.

Y6 – Manor Adventure/Activity Week

It has been very quiet around school this week whilst Y6 have been out and about on their various activities.

All of Y6 joined in with fun activities on the school grounds on Tuesday, led by Premier Sport.
